– disclosure of data on individuals to Swedish authorities for research purposes

Use this document as a template when assessing whether research data can be disclosed. This applies if the information is subject to secrecy as per Section 7 of the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Ordinance (OSF) or Chapter 24, Section 8 of the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Act (OSL), and if:

- the recipient is a Swedish authority, such as a higher education institution; and
- the data are intended for research purposes.

The information has been collected either directly from the individual or from someone else.

Information about the *personal or financial circumstances of individuals* in the above-noted studies that can be attributed to the individual is subject to absolute secrecy according to Section 7 of the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Ordinance (OSF).

Information about the *personal or financial circumstances of an individual* that Umeå University has received from someone other than the individual. Umeå University has received data from statistical authorities, such as the National Board of Health and Welfare or Statistics Sweden with

transferred secrecy, or from another higher education institution for use in research.

Data from statistical authorities about the *personal or financial circumstances of an individual* and that can be attributed to the individual are subject to absolute secrecy as per Chapter 24, Section 8 of the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Act (OSL). Secrecy applies to specific activities of an authority that relate to the production of statistics. Secrecy has been transferred to Umeå University with support of Chapter 11, Section 3 of the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Act (OSL).

Provisions overriding secrecy

Data subject to secrecy may only be disclosed if there is a provision overriding secrecy or providing exemptions from secrecy. Provisions overriding secrecy and exemptions from secrecy for, among other things, disclosure for research purposes are found in Chapter 24, Section 8, third paragraph of the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Act (OSL).

Secrecy examinations

Conditions

The following conditions are met:

- The recipient of the data is a Swedish authority.
- The recipient will use the requested data for research purposes.

The recipient has ethical approval covering the research:

or

Ethical approval is not required for the research in which the recipient plans to use the data.

Examination of damage

According to Chapter 24, Section 8, third paragraph of the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Act (OSL), information that the recipient needs for research purposes and information that is pseudonymised or that is not in any other way directly attributable to the individual may be disclosed if it is clear that the information can be disclosed without the individual or anyone close to the individual suffering harm or injury.

For individuals not to be considered to suffer harm or injury, all of the following protections must be in place:

The disclosed data are pseudonymised.

Back tracking is not possible. (*Back tracking means that an individual cannot be identified based on other associated data except through the use of a code key.*)

The secrecy level of the data at Umeå University also applies to the receiving authority, either as primary secrecy as per Section 7 of the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Ordinance (OSF) or as transferred secrecy as per Chapter 11, Section 3 of the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Act (OSL).

Assessment

I assess that the above data can be disclosed to the recipient for research purposes without being subject to secrecy as it is clearly determined that the disclosure will occur without harm or injury to individuals or their close relations.

Because the data include sensitive information, transfer to the recipient is to occur securely using systems that Umeå University has approved.
